Cardinal Leger School



The November and December months provided many opportunities and special celebrations for the students, families, and staff at Cardinal Leger School.

The SRC organized several spirit days. Green Day was a tremendous success as everyone dressed in the colors of the Rough Riders and Rider tattoos were distributed to all students and staff as Saskatchewan's team was preparing for the Grey Cup. The entire school also dressed in the Christmas colors of red and green in December. Each student earned ten points for their house league team by participating in spirit days and we have a close race in the standings after seven events. The Missionaries lead followed closely behind by the Martyrs, the Apostles, and the Saints. In the spirit of giving, the SRC organized Coats for Kids. Donations of gently used winter jackets were collected and they provided the Saskatoon Open Door Society with fifteen boxes of clothing. Service projects were also coordinated and students were given the opportunity to volunteer in the school in many ways such as reading to younger students, helping teachers with bulletin boards and classroom work, volunteering in the library, and cleaning various areas of the school. As well, all students and staff supported our Christmas Hampers by providing food items and donations.

The Cardinal Leger CSCC organized our school mascot contest. All students were asked to submit a picture of a cardinal which would be used for murals in the gymnasium. Students earned twenty points for their house team with a submission and there were 92 entries! The SRC and CSCC selected one cardinal logo which is now painted in all corners of the gym with each house team's name. As well, the CSCC purchased a cardinal costume so that our mascot will be present during all assemblies and special celebrations in the future! The next CSCC meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 11th at 7:00 pm. All families and community members are welcome to attend.

The Advent season gave us many opportunities to prepare and celebrate the birth of Christ. All students participated in student-led liturgies and in our Christmas concert which was held at St. Joseph High School. Students and staff displayed their wonderful gifts of song, drama, and dance in their performances and it was a special evening that recognized the uniqueness of our community and the message of Christmas in our faith.

The New Year has students participating in several extra-curricular activities. Grade four to eight boys and girls are now preparing for the track season and our grade seven and eight students are also beginning practices as the basketball season approaches.

Kindergarten registration is now occurring for the 2010-11 school year. Parents who have children that will be five years of age by January 31st, 2011 can register. Cardinal Leger School is a dual stream school which offers instruction in both English and French. Bus transportation is provided. AN UPDATE FROM YOUR CITY COUNCILLOR...



Welcome to 2010 and I hope that you are having a good winter. It has been a relatively easy winter so far...with very cold weather during the Christmas season and not very much snow. I am sure we will still get some snow and I hope that it will be easily manageable in our Ward!

I know that the biggest issue in Ward 10 is the traffic getting in and out of the area. I continue to address this with the city administration. We will be looking at more traffic signals, four way stops etc in the future and traffic calming in some areas. If you have specific concerns please let me know.

I often hear about the lack of a water feature/ civic centre of some sort in Ward 10. But, before we start building new facilities...the city really needs to know what we need and want. So, to this end, City Council approved in the Capital Budget in December a Future Recreation Needs Assessment Study. The Study is to assess the future demand and type of indoor sport and recreation facilities in response to a growing population and changing demographic in Saskatoon over the next twenty years. This study will take 1 – 2 years to complete and along with public input we will look at some of the facilities that other municipalities have so that we ensure that we cover all bases in determining what we need in the city and in the Northeast area of the city.

I also continue to work with the city and the RM of Corman Park in regards to Lowe Road and Central Avenue going out the Wildlife Federation. It is an ongoing concern and there now is money allocated in the budget for regular maintenance of the roads until such time that they are all paved.

Silverspring is a great neighbourhood. I appreciate working with the schools, the community association and the churches to ensure that it stays that way. There is wonderful community spirit in Silverspring and I commend you all for that!

Please don't hesitate to contact me with any comments, concerns or questions. I like to hear from you. Please keep in mind that the city's spam filter is very intense and therefore if you have not heard from me on an email within a reasonable amount of time it means I did not receive it. Please call me then on one of my phone numbers. Thanks for your cooperation on this.

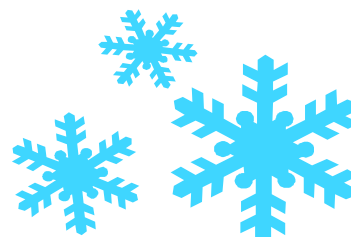
