- Silverspring Community Association honours other community association memberships. Memberships may be purchased on registration night. Memberships are valid for one year.
- Classes require a parent/adult convener or they cannot run. This person is responsible for phoning participants in advance of the program start date to remind them of the dates/cancelled dates, ensuring that the facility rules are followed, aiding the instructor if necessary and distributing evaluation forms. AN UPDATE FROM YOUR CITY COUNCILLOR...



I hope you are enjoying your summer. The parks and yards are looking very nice with the sun and rain that we have had. We live in a great area of the city and I know we are all proud of that!

The “Wildlife Corridor Signs” are going up in Silverspring. There are 2 signs at this point and they will be installed on Konihowski, one facing east and one facing west. These signs, if you recall are to specifically deal with the large amount of deer that go through the sub division. In fact, there are about 26 deer that live in the natural grasslands and walk through to the river! In regards to the placement of the signs, there are restrictions as to where they can be placed and consideration is given to the road visibility and the underground infrastructure services. Obviously they are only located in the wildlife corridor. When you receive this newsletter they should have been installed already! This will all be monitored as to whether more signs are needed in Silverspring. The program will be expanded into the Evergreen neighbourhood in the future.

The management and staff at the Saskatoon Forestry Farm Park and Zoo identified in early May (as well as concerns from residents specifically from ward 10, and visitors from other parts of the city and from out of town) that entering the facility on weekends was going to be continue to be problematic as the number of cars and visitors to the site had dramatically increased from previous years. In an attempt to speed up the process of entering the site, additional staff were found to cover a rover position during the peak weekend hours. This position actually walks along the row of cars entering the Forestry Farm and collects the parking fee for the facility. This initiative has reduced the wait time to enter the Forestry Farm from in excess of twenty minutes to an average of five minutes. We are very happy with this initiative and thank our guests for their patience while we adjusted to an increase in attendance. This is also appreciated by us, the people living in the vicinity as no one likes traffic constantly backed up. Thank you to the Forestry Farm Park and Zoo for dealing in a positive way with this issue.

Paws Inn staff is tracking Forestry Farm visitors from countries other than Canada. They are very happy to report that the Saskatoon Forestry Farm Park and Zoo has hosted visitors from sixteen countries representing every continent except Antarctica and South America so far this season. This is one sign of the growing tourism opportunities that Saskatoon has to offer our visiting guests. And, this is all happening in the Silverspring neighbourhood!!!!!!

The City of Saskatoon’s two free compost depots have been open since June. Residents of Saskatoon are encouraged to reduce the amount of waste sent to the landfill by bringing their leaves and grass to the depots, located on McOrmond Drive just north of 8th Street East, and on Highway 7 across from 11th Street. The depots will be open from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on week days, and from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekends. New this year, the depots will also accept tree and shrub material. Branches and tree trunks greater than 4 inches in diameter must be cut into sections no longer than 24 inches to allow material processing. Due to the threat of Dutch Elm Disease, Provincial regulations prohibit the acceptance of Elm and any other material that cannot be distinguished from Elm, at the compost depots. These materials will not be accepted at the depots, but can be disposed of at the landfill. Also new this year,

the landfill will no longer accept loads of unbagged leaves and grass. All clean loads of leaves and grass must be taken to the compost depots. For additional information, please visit www.saskatoon.ca and search under “c” for compost depots or call 975-2486. The City of Saskatoon is once again working with the Saskatchewan Waste Reduction Council to sell subsidized backyard composters to Saskatoon residents to help reduce the amount of organics going to the Landfill. The limited number of composters, which are sold for \$45 each (half the usual retail price), are available at either of the City’s compost depots.

In keeping with cleaning and maintenance, the Saskatoon landfill has a new phone number for residents to call to receive current estimated wait times at the facility. **The number is 281-8669.** The phone number directs callers to a recorded message, updated hourly throughout the day from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., which provides the estimated entrance wait time. For information on tipping fees and hours of operation, please visit the City’s website or call 975-2496. The Saskatoon Landfill is located on Dundonald Avenue South.

I want to remind you that the hours of operation of City parks are from 5:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight. The City is asking for the cooperation of the public by contacting the Saskatoon Police Service at 975-8300 if you notice any damage or suspicious activity in parks. Along with this, I also urge residents to volunteer for your local Citizen Patrol to help keep our neighborhoods safe. For information on the location and amenities of City parks, please visit www.saskatoon.ca and look under “P” for Parks – Amenities.

With the warmer weather fireworks become more prevalent in the city. To that end, City Council approved a report recommending bylaw changes so that: a permit is required to sell fireworks; there is no limit on the number of days to sell fireworks; sellers must handle the fireworks as per local and federal regulations; fireworks cannot be set off from private property to public property without a permit; and that fireworks can only be set off between dusk and 11:00 p.m. on Victoria Day, Canada Day, Labour Day, and between dusk on New Year’s Eve and 00:15 a.m. on New Year’s Day. No permit is required for a private fireworks display on private property, as per the existing bylaw, but fireworks on public property will now require a permit. Tickets will be issued for any violation of the bylaw.

If you have any questions or concerns please don’t hesitate to contact me. I appreciate hearing from you and helping you with your issues. In regards to email, if you don’t hear from me in a reasonable amount of time, please call me. The city spam filter is very thorough and even legitimate messages are blocked. Take care and enjoy the summer. Be safe!!!
