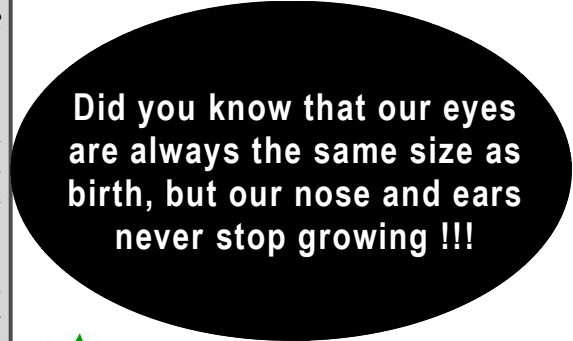
There are many spots available for Family Swim. This program runs Sunday evenings from 7-8:30 pm at Lakewood Civic Center with the water slide and hot tub.
