

SCCA Soccer Registration FAQs

Indoor Season 2018-19

1. What are the age groups, prices and nights of play?

Note that Saskatoon Youth Soccer Inc (SYSI) schedules the games for U5-U9, and SCCA does not have control over the schedule.

Important Information:

- Season starts week of October 21 to early March.
- Kinder soccer players **must be at least 3 years old** at the time of play
- Kinder soccer teams have practices/ non-competitive games once a week.
- No underage players are permitted in U5
- The game dates for U9 are subject to change given new formats for U9 and U9-Development League.
- Nights of play and number of players in games are subject to change.

No refunds will be issued after registration.

2. When is soccer registration in SCCA?

August 7 - September 9th, 2018

3. Can I register for SCCA soccer online?

Yes! Registration is solely online and U5, U7 and U9 players and coaches must register (free) on Saskatoon Youth Soccer, Goalie website.

4. What if my child's year of birth is 2009 or earlier?

Your child should be enrolled in Youth Soccer through our zone (Hollandia Soccer). See www.hollandiasoccer.ca and www.saskatoonyouthsoccer.ca.

5. My child is small/inexperienced. Can they play down a level?

No, unfortunately this is not permitted by Saskatoon Youth Soccer. Note that SYSI considers U5-U9 to be non-competitive. Scores are not kept during games.

6. Can I register for U9 Developmental league through SCCA?

Registration for U9 Developmental league is through the Aurora zone. Please see www.aurorasoccer.ca and www.saskatoonyouthsoccer.ca for details.

7. Can a player register on a Community League team as well as a Zone D-League team?

Effective Indoor 2018-19, there are no longer restrictions for playing in both and the player may be registered in both leagues. The player and parent must take into consideration the number of training and game times which will take place on a weekly basis between the two and make a decision as to how much is safe for the player.

8. When and where are U5-U9 practices held?

For U5, U7, and U9, teams will practice in schools. We hope to have practices in Silverspring and Mother Teresa school gyms, space permitting. Practices will be scheduled Monday-Friday between 6-9 p.m. Practice frequency, times and dates will depend on available gym time, the number of teams that sign up, and coach preferences. You will find out your practice times from your coach.

9. Do I need to pay to get into the soccer centres to see my child's games?

Yes- here is some information from SYSI:

Indoor Soccer Centre Season Admission Passes: (2-for-1 sale) Sept 15 - Oct 31, 2018

Those over the age of 18 will require an admission pass to watch soccer games at the soccer centres. There will be a 2-for-1 season admission pass sale in effect from Sept 15 to Oct 31. The season passes are \$20 each or \$3 per day, however during the sale when one pass is purchased

at \$20 a second one will be provided for free. The passes are good from October 1, 2018 to Sept 31, 2019 and are not valid at tournaments.

10. Are U7 and U9 teams co-ed or gender specific?

Both U7 and U9 are gender specific but SYS will allow female players on boy's teams for U7 and U9 if there are not enough players to form a team. The coordinators will also be communicating with other community associations to determine what their numbers look like. If we do not have enough girls or boys to form a team we will ask other community associations if they have players or if they need players if we have surplus of players.

11. What equipment do players need?

Tim Hortons will be sponsoring the U5 and U7 Timbits leagues this season. They will provide jerseys, soccer balls, socks, shorts and medals for each U5 and U7 teams. Shin guards are recommended for U5-U9. If shin guards are worn, they must be covered in order to prevent injury to other players. Most of the older players wear soccer cleats. For U9 team shirts and soccer balls are provided.

12. Can I coach?

Yes! We are always in need of coaches. If we don't have a coach for a team we will unfortunately not be able to field the team and will have slot of disappointed kids. You will have to try and register your child in another community associations to play.

So we urge you to please volunteer to coach your kids team - you don't need to be a Ronaldo or Christine Sinclair to coach your kids team so please do help us out.

13. What training do I need to Coach?

14. If I decide I want to volunteer to be a coach and take the coach certification requirements, does SCCA reimburse me for the courses.

Yes. SYSI provides a Team Personnel Honorarium Application. Upon completion of certification (s) simply fill out the application and SYSI will reimburse you directly.

15. Do I have to have a criminal record check if I decide to become a coach?

Yes. All coaches must have criminal records check (CRC) as mandated by Saskatchewan Soccer Association because soccer is considered to be working Vulnerable Persons i.e. children.

16. I would love to coach but with all the time it takes to complete the coaches training and have a criminal record check is it really worth it?

We understand with all the new training and CRC being implemented by SSA and SYS that you are losing family time. SCCA will be providing honorarium to all coaches that complete the required training for the age group they are coaching, the CRC and have coached the complete season.

17. I can't coach- how else can I help?

You can help with your team as manager or fund raising for tournaments or team events. Another option is to consider signing up as a soccer coordinator for next year. Contact anyone on the SCCA members if you are interested!

18. Is there an in-person registration night?

No, there will not be in-person registration for soccer this year.

19. Do I need to buy a new membership?

Family SCCA Memberships run September to August, so you will need a new membership if you have not purchased one since September. Memberships can be purchased online at the time of registration. Your child cannot play without a valid membership, and late purchased memberships will be assessed a 50% administrative charge. At time of soccer registration, WUHCA membership fee will be added to the first registered family member.

20. Can I register late?

If there is room on a team after September 9th, you may be able to register late by contacting the relevant coordinator (see below). Acceptance will be based on space availability. Late registrations are subject to a \$40 late fee.

21. Why is registration so early?

Saskatoon Youth Soccer requires teams to be formed by the early of October. Also, by offering a month long registration period, we hope to have everyone register before the deadlines.

22. Are spots limited?

No- there is no registration limit for on-time registrations. If we don't get enough coaches to volunteer, some players will not be able to play and will be refunded.

23. How do I get a membership card?

You will receive an email from the membership coordinator with details about how to get your card. For now, hold on to your email registration receipt as proof that you purchased a membership.

24. How can I pay for soccer?

Paying online is strongly encouraged. Alternatively you can mail a cheque payable to SCCA along with your child's name and age group to

Cheques must be mailed and postmarked by September 9th. Late payment is subject to a \$40 late fee or may result in losing your child's place on the team.

25. Can I make friend requests when registering?

Yes, you can request up to two friends for your child to play with. Head coaches can request more than two friends. Please realize that there are a lot of factors that go into forming teams, so these requests are not guaranteed.

26. When will I get team information?

Your coach should email you by last week of September. If not, contact soccer1@silverspringcommunity.ca
