**1. Call To Order**

**2. Approval of the Agenda**

**3. School news:**

**Silverspring – Krista and Arlene**

- school now has a bus with 40 riders currently with the thought that about 80 riders in the winter months
- 538 students with the possibility of 541 and 22 classrooms, and a welcome to new staff.
- HBAM – Healthy Bodies, Active Minds. A body break every 45 minutes with the focus on activity. This is a 3 – 5 year program.
- New Vice principal from Pleasant hill – Krista Segó.
- Cross country has started and Volleyball is soon to follow

**Mother Theresa – Carol Gerspacher**

- small increase in enrollment, up to 410 students and 15 teachers
- Participation in the Terry Fox marathon for Cancer.
- The AGM and meet the Teacher night are finished and a welcome back BBQ is to take place on Thursday.
- New Math program – Math Makes Sense includes grades 5 – 8 this year.
- Graffiti problem on the new playground and portable. This is a very serious problem and working closely with the police on this matter to resolve the situation.

## **8. New Business:**

- **A)** Mike wants to use Astro Jump instead of Apollo jump for Youth Nites because they have some new equipment and offering Mike a good deal. Not a problem. Youth nites starting up and will run every 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday with a few breaks/changes throughout the year.
- **B)** trouble finding coaches, especially for under 8 boys. Enough kids for under 8 boys for two teams but not enough coaching help. Kevin sent out multiple emails with no luck even letting parents know that people may have to be cut due to lack of volunteers. As of last Friday only one team was registered with SYS and may need to refund money to 10 registrants.
- Creative solutions for the future – looking at outside the community for help – university students, local high school students etc.
- Communication is the key – let parents know in advance that if the volunteer help is not found teams may have to be cancelled. Perhaps if parents knew that they had a bit of back up help (example students) to help they may be more prepared.
- Kevin and Vanessa will make the draw to see who is cut from the soccer team.

- Saskatoon Aurora Concorde's are looking for a donation to help send team to the National Soccer Championships in PEI. Decided yes to donate Money. Lori made a motion to donate \$400.00 on behalf of Silverspring Community Association and Vanessa 2<sup>nd</sup>. Carried.
- **C)** there has been an interest in the community, decided to check the matter out. Scott will distribute link to members to check out further.
- This is synthetic ice with a life span of approximately 25 yrs., and can be used all year round with regular skates. Scott will order 2 panels and have a demonstration.
- Some issues will have to be looked at such as zoning, moving rink.
- This would be a long term project - has had quotes from \$20,000 to \$76,000.
